We are pleased to announce that **Autism Central Hub** will be attending this meeting and will give a short presentation about their work and ways in which they can support families followed by a Q&A session for all your questions regarding anything to do with ASD.

The Autism Central Peer Education Programme is for parents, carers and Personal Assistants of autistic people of any age. They do not need a diagnosis to access the service. As promised in last week's newsletter, here are some helpful tips from our Eco-School council to improve the quality of our air...



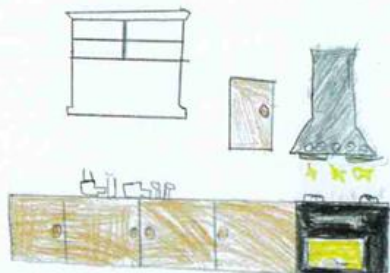

No waterproof? No Forest School!

To ensure all children can safely and fully take part in Forest School, they must come dressed appropriately, including a **waterproof coat**. We've recently reminded families—via the Q-Ahead newsletter, weekly school newsletter, and School Ping—of the importance of bringing waterproofs. Even on sunny days, children often engage in water play, and sudden downpours are common. **Children without a waterproof coat will not be able to attend Forest School**, as staff cannot return them to class mid-session. Thank you for your continued support.

Forest School Diary 23rd May 2025

The children in EYFS constructed fishing rods using sticks, string and pinecones for bait. Great fun was had fishing with them in the tuff trays full of water. Other activities enjoyed were bug hunting in the long grass and putting together a rickety old seesaw.



This week Year 1 tried another method of tie-dyeing by mixing turmeric added with salt and bringing the mixture to the boil over the fire. We hope this gives a better result than our previous method. With bridge building being part of the children's class topic, we decided to bring this out into the forest and the group constructed many different bridges using natural resources such as wooden planks, bricks and sticks.



Year 2 made 'feeling sticks' during their session. These were done using various colours of wool and ribbon wrapped around their stick. The colours used by the children represented their feelings, the children were able to reflect on different situations where they had felt happy, peaceful and at times a little sad or anxious.



This week Year 3 painted their comfort stones using colours such as yellow and green, both represent positivity and will hopefully give the children reassurance should they need it. Pond dipping in the sunshine was also enjoyed, the group were lucky enough to seek out many pond skaters, water boatmen and even a water scorpion!



This week Year 4 continued with their pinecone crafting, spiders were a popular choice of craft with many of the group choosing to make one. During the session we were greeted by a beautiful damselfly which we believed to be a female as it was striking green in colour.



Most of Year 5 finished their earthquake proof structures just in time for a massive Forest School Magnitude 7 quake to hit the woodland! Some structures fared better than others, but it was a lot of fun watching some of them rock and some of them roll! After the half term we will be continuing our geography focus and turning our hand to making magnificent magna-exploding volcanoes!



Year 6 were let loose with their creativity this week and started to design upcycled wooden crosses. There were many different ideas the group had such as using stones, leaves and small clusters of wool rolled up to resemble roses to decorate them. We look forward to sharing the finished results with you once complete.

It's the big question that's been around for years, but there's no single answer that will fit every age, there's no single piece of advice that will fit every family dynamic. Pinterest is an enormous and hugely popular platform. Known as a 'visual discovery engine' which basically means it is a user-to-user platform, meaning that individual users upload content for anyone else to see. You can use it for a variety of things to get ideas, create mood boards, scrapbooks and so much more. But because it is user to user there will be content that isn't suitable for everyone. Back in 2022, during the inquest into the death of a 14 year old, even Pinterest admitted the [platform wasn't safe](#).
