Dog Safety Assembly

On Wednesday, we were pleased to welcome Tracey from the Blue Cross charity, who visited our school to talk to the children about dog safety. The Blue Cross is a national charity that has been helping sick, injured, and homeless pets for over 125 years. As part of their education work, they visit schools to teach children how to care for animals and stay safe around them. During the assembly, pupils learned how to stay safe around dogs—an especially important topic for many of our children who spend time at the local Recreation Ground. The session was informative and engaging, helping children understand how to behave safely and respectfully around dogs in different situations. We hope the children found the talk helpful. Please do take a moment to speak with your child about what they learned—it's a great opportunity to reinforce these important messages at home.

Year 3 Trip to Harwich

On Tuesday Year 3 visited Harwich to understand how rivers and ports transport goods and natural resources. We began by visiting Ha'penny Pier, the Lifeboat Museum, the Kindertransport memorial and Trinity House. We then took a walk to the Sailing Club beach to have a look at the cargo ships and finished the day by visiting the high lighthouse and the low lighthouse.



Dress Like a Hero

This year, our School Council has chosen to support Help for Heroes, a charity that provides vital support to members of the armed forces and veterans. To help raise funds, we're inviting all children to take part in 'Dress Like a Hero Day' on Friday 4th July. No waterproof? No Forest School!

To ensure all children can safely and fully take part in Forest School, they must come dressed appropriately, including a **waterproof coat**. We've recently reminded families—via the Q-Ahead newsletter, weekly school newsletter, and School Ping—of the importance of bringing waterproofs. Even on sunny days, children often engage in water play, and sudden downpours are common. **Children without a waterproof coat will not be able to attend Forest School**, as staff cannot return them to class mid-session. Forest School Diary 13th June 2025

EYFS continue to craft their wood slice octopuses, using the palm drill to create holes ready to add tentacles at a later date. A spot of construction was also taking place as a group worked together to build a structure from sticks. The session was finished off with a fun game of hide and seek.



Year 1 have been working on extending their bridges in the woodland this week, bashing in the nails with the hammer and adding screws to tighten it up where necessary. The children worked great as a team throughout the construction process.



Hapa zome, crafting elder jewellery and bug hunting were just a few activities enjoyed by Year 2 during their Forest School session last week. One of the children was exceptionally brave holding a spider and letting it crawl all over him!



Year 3 did not have Forest School this week due to their trip to Harwich.

Year 4 took part in their high-ropes session this week. They took on the pirate challenge and braved the Leap of Faith. Well done to all of the children, pushing their boundaries and doing their best as usual!



We put our volcanologist skills to the test this week in Forest School, with week one of the Volcano Challenge. We used fizzy drink and mints to re-create an eruption and small pyroclastic flow. We talked about our results and tried very hard to use the correct terminology to describe our findings. Next week we will be exploring other chemical changes and techniques to make our eruptions even more powerful and will report back with what we discover.



Year 6 had a treat in the woods this week as they got to try nettle crisps and nettle tea. The children gathered, washed and seasoned the nettles to taste, using honey and lemon in the tea, and salt, vinegar and chilli powder for the crisps. Many of the group enjoyed the crisps so much they each took a small bag of nettles away with them to make at home.

Schedule of Trips and Visits 2024/2025

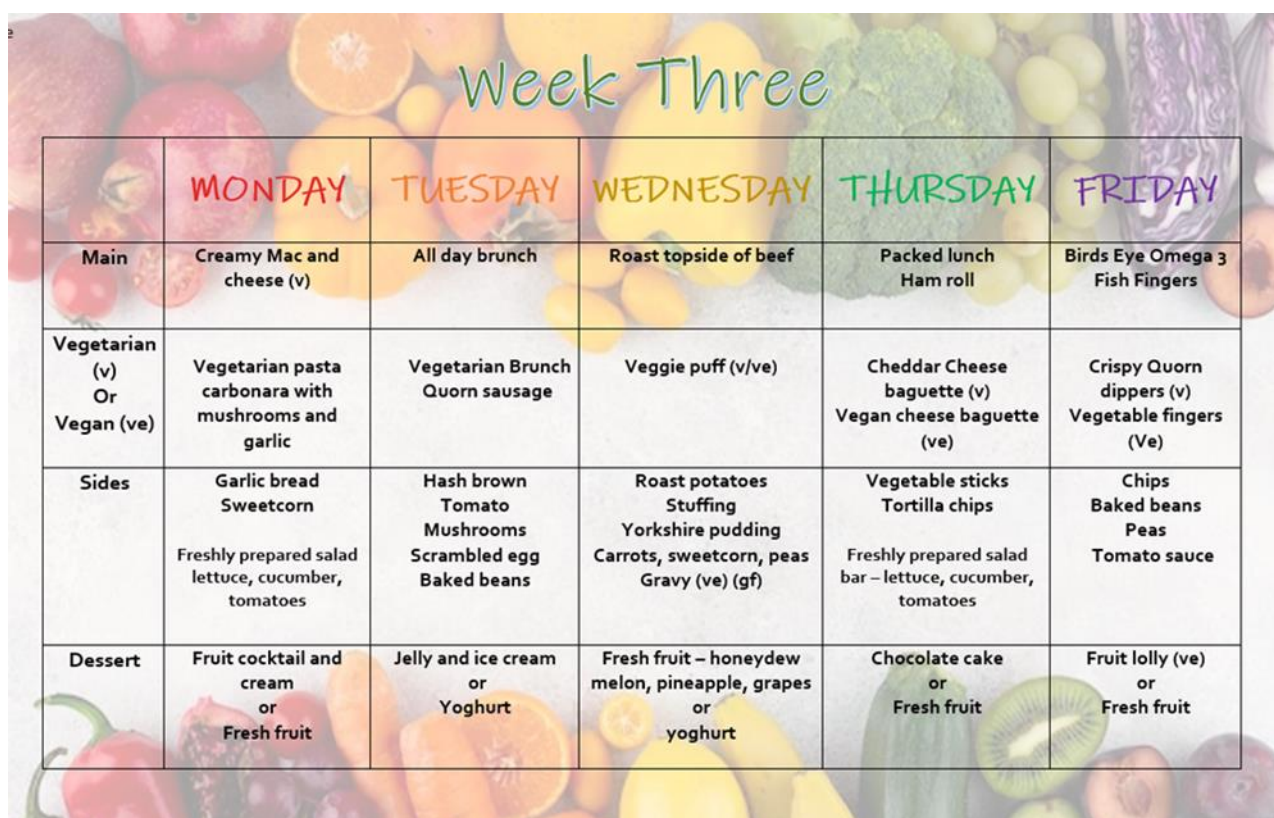
Budgeting £20 a quarter (£80 a year – or approximately £2 a term-time week) should cover the cost of trips. Where a trip is more expensive, for example £40, we will always try to make sure that over the academic year, the cost for all 4 Quarters comes to no more than £80 for the trips and visits we organise. Sadly, with school funding being at an all-time low in real terms, the school is financially unable to subsidise trips and visits to the extent it has done in the past. If we do not receive enough contributions to cover the cost, we will reluctantly have to cancel trips or visitors to the school. 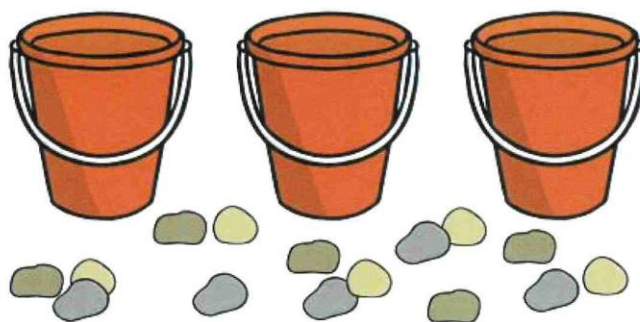

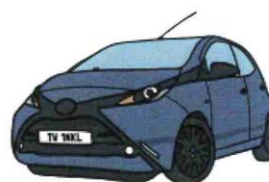
