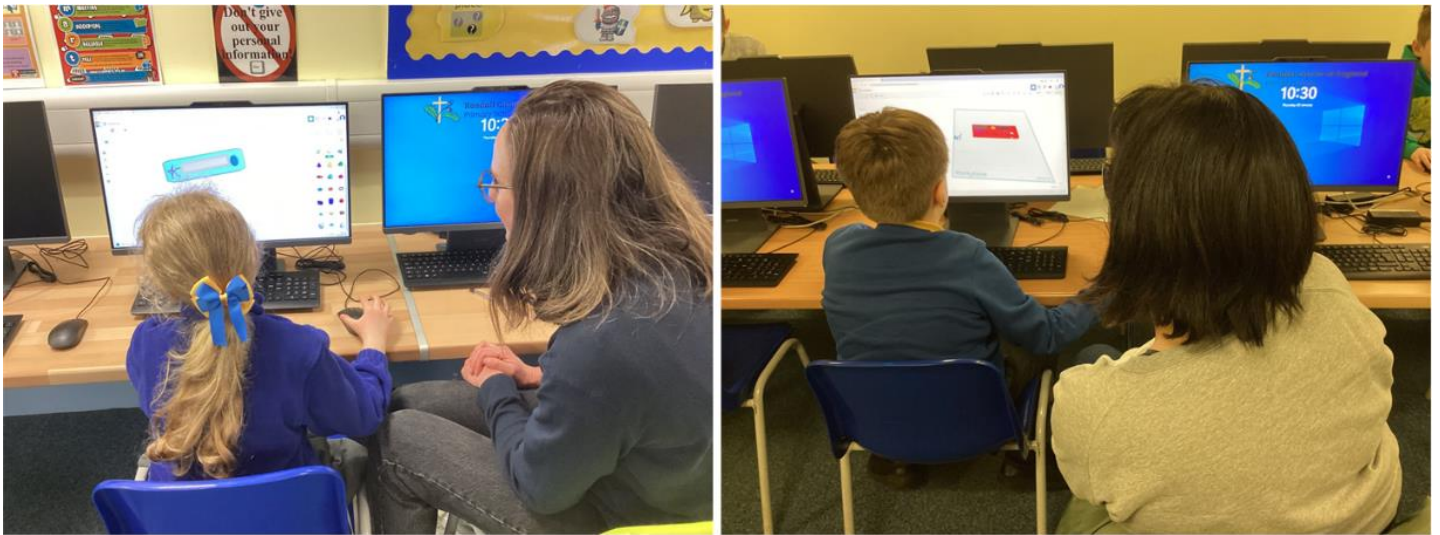

DT Parent & Child Workshop

On Thursday we held our third Parent and Child Workshop. Following successful art and maths sessions, this week it was design and technology (DT). Children and parents worked side by side to use the computer aided design (CAD) software we use in school to design their own keyring on screen and have a look at our new 3D printer in action. Designing in 3D on a computer is a tricky concept but all our children and parents did a great job; showing creativity and patience.



Calling all budding artists for the Royal Academy (RA) Young Artists' Summer Show

Now in its eighth year, the Young Artists' Summer Show is a free, open-submission exhibition for students studying in the UK. Artworks are judged by a panel of artists and arts professionals, with selected works displayed online and on-site at the Royal Academy of Arts. Each student can submit one artwork and there is no theme. Parents can enter their child's artwork online themselves, or, if you would like the school to submit on your behalf, you will need to send an image of the artwork (or the school can photograph it if brought in) and provide information such as the title, size, and text written by the artist explaining the work. Parent consent is required before submission. An entry form is attached to this newsletter; please print and complete it with the artwork, or request a copy from the school office if you do not have access to a printer. The RA's panel of judges will view all submissions, with selected pieces shown online and some exhibited at the Royal Academy of Arts. The RA has provided guidance on what judges look for. Artwork can be made in any medium, including painting, sculpture, photography, installation, video, or drawing. There is no theme, and artworks can be of any subject, provided the artist is aged 4–18 at the time of submission.

[Essex ActivAte half term clubs](#) are now live to book, which offer free spaces for eligible families across Essex. These clubs continue to play an important role in supporting local communities by providing school aged children with access to high quality activities, including sports, creative arts, wellbeing sessions, food education, and opportunities to build confidence and form new friendships. With nearly 100 clubs operating county wide, families can expect a diverse range of enriching experiences throughout the school break. A Holiday Activities voucher code is not required to book. Families can simply visit the Find Your Active Activity Finder, locate their nearest club, and contact the provider directly to secure a free place. Clubs are also offering paid for and paid spaces, so there is something for everyone at an Essex ActivAte club!

Forest School Diary 30th January 2026

EYFS made different patterns by cutting various shapes out of leaves. We spoke about how they were symmetrical and resembled snowflakes.



The children in Year 1 took part in a whale blubber experiment this week. This is where lard is placed inside a glove to represent the fat of the whale, the children then insert their hand into the glove before submerging it into ice cold water. The children discovered how the blubber enables the whale (and their hand) to keep warm.



Year 2 have been investigating mini beasts and their habitats during Forest School. The children searched the woodland to see what they could find and where to find it. All results were recorded on the chart provided for the children to complete.



Year 3 braved the pouring rain this week and set off on a search for different soil types. Once found, each soil was investigated thoroughly in the way of colour, texture and moisture. The children logged down all results on their worksheets and will use this information to support their science topic back in the classroom.



Year 4 put together bug hotels this week. The children made many different types for various creatures using an assortment of materials. We plan to finish them off next week and hope to see lots of resident bugs moving in.



Year 5 continued working on the Greek clay pots they had started previously. These will now be put through the kiln to fire and will be painted at a later date.



It was time for Year 6 to take to the high ropes this week. Climbing to the top of the Pirate Challenge was the task in hand and a great job was done by all.



Reminder: Forest School Clothing

We learn outside all year round, and **all children take part in Forest School in all weather conditions**. Recently, many **children have been arriving without adequate clothing** for the **freezing temperatures**, and several are not wearing hats, scarves or gloves. Some children without waterproofs are also not bringing a spare change of clothes, resulting in them staying in cold, wet clothing for the rest of the day. 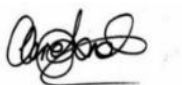

Schedule of Trips and Visits 2025/2026

Budgeting £20 a quarter (£80 a year – or approximately £2 a term-time week) should cover the cost of trips. Where a trip is more expensive, for example £40, we will always try to make sure that over the academic year, the cost for all 4 Quarters comes to no more than £80 for the trips and visits we organise. Sadly, with school funding being at an all-time low in real terms, the school is financially unable to subsidise trips and visits to the extent it has done in the past. If we do not receive enough contributions to cover the cost, we will reluctantly have to cancel trips or visitors to the school. 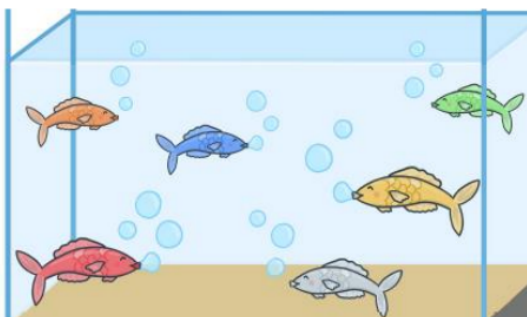
