Beat the Street – Team Kendall!



Beat the Street is coming to Colchester. Beat the Street is a real-life walking, cycling and wheeling game for whole community, which runs from Wednesday 11th March 2026 – Wednesday 22nd April 2026. Players collect points by visiting different locations on the map while travelling around the area. Players can walk, cycle, scoot, run or wheel. Collect as many points as possible by visiting Beat Boxes across Colchester. School teams are able to win hundreds of pounds of sport or book vouchers by getting the most points and we want you all to play for Team Kendall!

How to play?

Playing the game is easy. Your child will be given a card for themselves and a card for you to play along with too.

1. Create your Beat the Street account on the website at beatthestreet.me/colchester or by downloading our Beat the Street App.
2. Add family members and register a card to player profiles. **Remember to join Kendall Primary School's team!**
3. Start your journey. Find your nearest Beat Box using a paper or digital map and hover your card at the contactless Beat Box until it beeps and flashes. If playing with the app, tap the Beat Box icon on your phone and swipe to collect points. There will be a Beat Box on the lamppost where Recreation Road meet Port Lane – remember to check in each day.
4. Visit 2 Beat Boxes within an hour and collect 10 points for each Beat Box – this is 20 points for the journey.
5. Carry on your journey. Score 10 points for each extra Box you visit.

More information was given out to children yesterday to take home.

Forest School Diary 6th March 2026

Last week in the woodland the children in EYFS celebrated Chinese New Year by making Chinese lanterns. There was also a little Chinese dancing going on here and there and, of course, lots of exploring!



Playing in the mud, baking mud pies and planting wildflower seeds were just some of the activities Year 1 got to partake in during this week's Forest School session, whilst enjoying the beautiful sunshine.



Year 2 used their Forest School skills to craft dream catchers from willow strips, carefully weaving wood throughout the willow to finish them off. A few of the group put together some Beatrix Potter inspired art using natural resources found in the woodland.



Year 3 made good use of the rope bridge made by Year 6 this week. The children put their balancing skills to the test as they all made their way across. The group agreed it was rather wobbly but they all did very well not to fall off! We finished off the session with a blindfolded rope walk.



Year 4 took to the high ropes this week. The task in hand was climbing up the cargo net as high as possible and taking on the 'leap of faith'. There was a great effort from all of the children involved and Miss Goodwin, who leapt for the first time herself, was cheered on by all the children!



This week, Year 5 designed and made a model sized shadoof in the woodland. The children were able to see what worked well and what didn't, before making a full-sized version next week. Once finished, we will put them to the test to collect water from our pond area.



This week, Year 6 tested the rope bridge they had previously made. We attached the bridge in between two trees and suspended it from the ground. The children then took it in turns to crawl along the bridge, putting their every faith in each other's knots. We are pleased to report the bridge stood up to the test and everybody made it safely to the end!



Reminder: Forest School Clothing

We learn outside all year round, and **all children take part in Forest School in all weather conditions**. Recently, many **children have been arriving without adequate clothing** for the **freezing temperatures**, and several are not wearing hats, scarves or gloves. Some children without waterproofs are also not bringing a spare change of clothes, resulting in them staying in cold, wet clothing for the rest of the day. 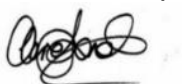

Schedule of Trips and Visits 2025/2026

Budgeting £20 a quarter (£80 a year – or approximately £2 a term-time week) should cover the cost of trips. Where a trip is more expensive, for example £40, we will always try to make sure that over the academic year, the cost for all 4 Quarters comes to no more than £80 for the trips and visits we organise. Sadly, with school funding being at an all-time low in real terms, the school is financially unable to subsidise trips and visits to the extent it has done in the past. If we do not receive enough contributions to cover the cost, we will reluctantly have to cancel trips or visitors to the school. 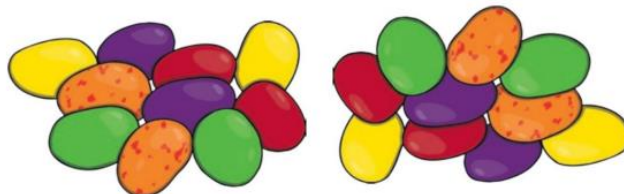

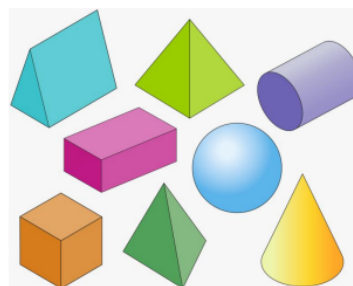
