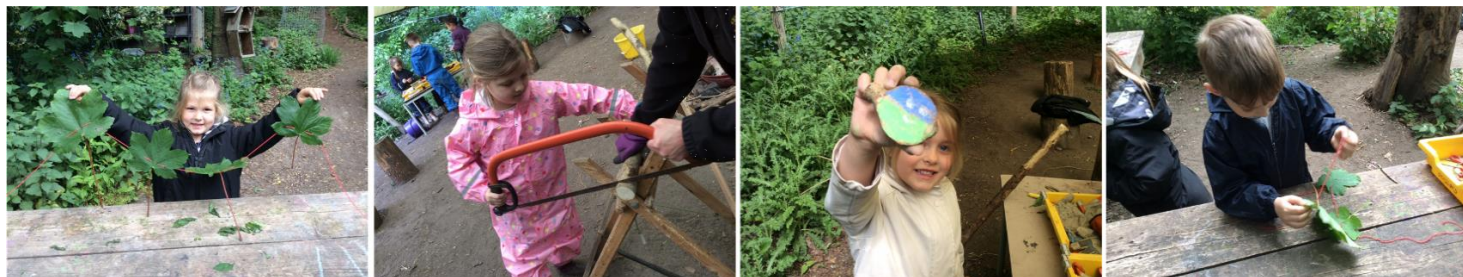


329 Forest School Diary 8th May 2026

EYFS enjoyed various activities during Forest School from chilling out in the hammock to creating a small farm using sticks and leaves. A few of the children found the time for a story while hiding out in the shelter.



Year 1 used sycamore leaves to practise leaf threading, these were then hung up in the woodland to make decorations. The children then used the bow saw to cut small rounds of wood that were then decorated using chalk.



Year 2 used the small magnifying glasses to examine plants close up. The children were able to spot things like the veins, hairs, and even the micro bugs resting on the leaves.



This week in the woodland Year 3 indulged themselves into many activities such as whittling to create story sticks, hapa zome art and weaving Gods eye creations. A small group of the children began to construct a shelter using sticks and logs found on the woodland floor.



Year 4 took part in a woodland treasure hunt this week, finding natural items that feature in the woodland at this time of the year. The group then used elder wood to craft jewellery such as necklaces and bracelets.



This week Year 5 enjoyed a spot of bird watching in the woodland and were able to identify many different species such as the great tit, robin, black bird and more. The children also enjoyed crafting woodland confetti using fun leaf cutters.
